





- Proposed policy complements UoM student and Human Resource policies
- Covers all areas of MU Sport: affiliated clubs, fitness services, social sport, events
- Outlines a zero-tolerance of discrimination based on LGBTI+ attributes:
 - Direct discrimination
 - Indirect discrimination
 - Casual discrimination
- Gender affirming practices in the sport
 - Gender-based competitions
 - Facility use
 - Uniforms


